To remain unmarried was an uncommon choice of life for women, but many women choose to be unmarried nowadays. Every women who chooses to live an unmarried life will pass through five processes to come to a stable decision. The five processes are appraising the challenge, surveying alternatives, weighing alternatives, deliberating about commitment, and adhering despite negative feedback.
