

ABSTRACT

Sexual drive is a part of human life, but people tend to consider this aspect as dominant aspect on sexual offenders. This research is aimed at portraying the dynamics of psychology of male sexual offenders. Four male sexual offenders from Cipinang Prison voluntarily participated in this research, and data collection was conducted between the month of June to October 2005. Qualitative analysis found that sexual drive was not the only dominant factor that influences the offenders to conduct their act of rape, and there are other factors influencing them which are malfunctioning superego, weak ego, borderline personality disorder, and antisocial personality disorder. The malfunctioning aspect of their personality are also influenced by parental inconsistencies during their childhood, unpleasant childhood experience related to family instability, unstable interpersonal relationships, primarily with their opposite sexual partners.
