

ABSTRACT

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Self-Efficacy in HIV positive Mothers in Doing Parenting; Debora Basaria, M.Psi; Undergraduate Program in Psychology, Tarumanagara University, (i-xi ; 123 Pages; R1-R3; Appdx 1-13)

HIV positive is a disease that classified in chronic disease. People that infect by HIV positive have an impact on a lot of things when people have parenting on children, that's effect on self-efficacy. Feist and Feist (2006) explained that the Individuals with unhealthy physiological state can affect the ability of self-efficacy in dealing with day-to-day activities, such individuals may lose confidence, feel apathy and helplessness so do not get optimal results. The aim of this study was to determine the self-efficacy in HIV-infected women in making positive parenting. The method called in-depth interview was conducted towards three early adulthood woman (aged from 25-40 years old) who are HIV-positive and do the parenting. This study uses a qualitative in-depth interviews as a way of collecting data and measuring devices parental self-efficacy as a supporter of the interview. The study lasted three months, from October 2013 until December 2013. The result show that all subjects who are HIV positive and still be able to have the ability to have a good parenting with healthy physical condition, so that the subjects had high self-efficacy. High self-efficacy gained from the success of antiretroviral therapy, the support of family and friends, as well as low levels of stress and anxiety.
